Sensory Worx encourages all its people to discuss safety on a regular basis and to bring any safety concerns to the attention of their manager at the earliest opportunity. Sensory Worx will review its safety policies on a regular basis to ensure that they remain current and comprehensive.

While managers are accountable for ensuring the procedures we set out are implemented, every staff member is expected to play their part by working safely. Supporting guidelines are laid out in each individual policy along with their accompanying risk assessments.

Health & Safety

Sensory Worx believes that all staff have the right to work in safety, and that our working environment should also provide safe spaces for our clients.

Sensory Worx will therefore:

- Provide and maintain equipment and systems of work that are safe and without risk to health.
- Provide and maintain safe working environments for staff with adequate and appropriate welfare facilities.
- Ensure that all employees are fit and competent for the work they do.
